Parents and Guardians,

The unconventional year has started off well. The students are doing a great job following classroom rules as well as social distancing expectations. There has only been a minimal amount of behavior referrals issued to the students. Ms. Anderson's 5th-hour class won the October Tiger Buck challenge! Great work! JH Students receive Tiger Bucks for great behavior:)

There are a couple of logistic reminders during this pandemic.

All JH REMOTE students need to sign in on their student portal for every class, including study hall, before joining in the Google Meet on Google Classroom. The student can be marked absent from virtual participation by the portal system if the student does not sign in for their class time, or if the teacher does not mark the student as participating. This includes students that are temporary remote learning due to pandemic reasons. These absences count toward state reporting. Only your child's teacher can verify participation in remote learning.

Remote Learning families:

If you have a student who is remote learning, please be sure to call the office if your student is going to miss any part of the school day during remote learning time. This includes any students who have been assigned to temporary remote learning by the school due to pandemic reasons.

In-Person Learning families:

No visitors, including parents, are allowed in the HS/JH buildings. If you need to drop off an item for your student, please have it labeled with the student's name, buzz at the security door to let us know you are here to drop it off, and then leave it on the bench or table in the entryway.

If your student is getting picked up during the school day, please notify the office in advance. They will get a pass to watch for a parent/guardian at the entrance and come out to meet you when you arrive. If your student is arriving at school later during the school day, please notify the office in advance and you may drop them off at the entrance. The office will check them in and collect a doctor's note if they were at an appointment.

ACADEMIC INFORMATION:

College Visits:

A reminder that Seniors are allowed 2 college visit days as excused absences and Juniors are allowed 1. In the Spring, seniors will be allowed an additional visit on SAT/PSAT testing day.

Did you know that you can receive daily or weekly notifications from your student's *Google Classrooms*? As a guardian, you can get email summaries about your student's activity in Classroom. Email summaries do not include grades.

In email summaries, you can review:

Missing work—Work not turned in when the summary was sent. Upcoming work—Work that's due today and tomorrow (for daily emails) or that's due in the upcoming week (for weekly emails). Class activities—Announcements, assignments, and questions recently posted by teachers.

To get email summaries of your student's work, you must accept an email invitation from a teacher. You can unsubscribe from summaries or remove yourself as a guardian at any time.

Steps to receive notification:

- 1. The teacher emails you an invitation to join your student's class.
- 2. In your email program, open your email invitation and accept.

In addition, the <u>parent portal on Infinite Campus</u> is a great tool to monitor grades and assignments. If you do not have a parent portal, or cannot gain access to yours, please contact Jen Thurman to get it set up. thurmanj@sherrard.us

As we head towards winter, still dealing with the pandemic, it's more important than ever to keep an eye out for signs of depression, especially in teenagers. With so many things important to teenagers disrupted — school, seeing friends, sports, and other activities that shape identity — many kids are struggling, even those without a history of depression or anxiety. Please read the article <u>Signs of Depression</u> if you have any concerns.

With a mix of students in school and at home, we feel it is important to expand our reach to students that may be struggling. Every other week students complete an online emotional check-in form. The emotional check-in is a safe place for students to share their emotions and a quick way for the counseling staff to assess mental health needs. After completing the emotional check-in, the counseling staff will complete individual check-ins with students that were in the struggling categories. For remote learners, the counseling staff will offer a zoom meeting or phone call to discuss their feelings.

Jesse Hamerlinck from the Mercer County Mental Health Action Program is also providing support services to students and families through case management. She is located in the HS counseling office on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday. The Mental Health Action Program works to address students' social emotional wellness, provide resources and referrals for mental health and wellness services, and eliminate barriers to care. The action program may also assist with other social determinants of health such as food insecurity, housing, and financial issues. 
RED FLAGS FOR PARENTS

Are you putting too much pressure on your child during the college admissions process?

Intense achievement pressure is generating high levels of stress and depression in many children, particularly in affluent communities. As parents, we need to be mindful of how we contribute to this pressure. Here are some question to ask yourself. Put a check next to each question you answer "YES" to.

If you answered "YES" to any of these questions, it may be time to re-evaluate your approach to your child's education, to take a close look at the messages you may be inadvertently sending your child, and to talk with those you respect and trust about how you might reduce college admission pressure. INSTRUCTIONS FOR PARADE PARTICIPANTS

- 1. Each float should not exceed \$150.00 in construction costs. The name of the organization or class must be clearly marked on both sides of the float.
- 2. The theme for this year's parade is High School Musical, "We're All In This Together". Sherrard's opponent is Riverdale. Their mascot is the Rams and their colors are black and gold.
- 3. Floats are preferable for the parade, but you may enter a decorated car or truck or a walking ensemble.
- 4. Float riders must be approved on an individual basis determined by float design and number of riders.
- 5. Vehicles pulling floats should be driven by licensed drivers who have proof of insurance in their vehicle.
- 6. Float decorating cannot be done during school hours and should be stopped by 10:00 p.m. Float construction may begin Sunday, January 10, 2021. A class sponsor or other responsible adult must be present at each decorating session.
- 7. The parade will start from THE OLD HIGH SCHOOL at 10:00 a.m. Saturday, January 16, 2021. The parade will assemble in the **GRASS FIELD AT THE OLD HIGH SCHOOL at 8:00 a.m. sharp**. The parade will end at the south end of the old school.
- 8. No items, including candy and gum, may be **thrown** during the parade. If you plan to pass out items, you may walk along the parade route and hand them to spectators. IT IS VERY IMPORTANT THAT CANDY BE HANDED OUT BY WALKERS ALONG THE PARADE ROUTE AND NOT BE THROWN!
- 9. After the parade, floats should be returned to where they were constructed for the purpose of dismantling.
- 10. Immediately following the parade, the "Best of the Classes" dance-off will be held at the high school. Float winners and the 2020 King and Queen will also be announced at this time.
